Superintendent's Summary

Student Representatives to the Board, Allie Spielbauer and Addie Huster reported on the various activities of the high school.

Mrs. Volkmann gave the food service report and highlighted the number of meals served this year. She spoke to the addition of smoothies at the high school which elicited excitement from the student representatives to the board. Mrs. Volkman also spoke to the need for a larger freezer and cooler at the elementary for the district food service program.

Mrs. Huster spoke to the winter benchmark scores. There was discussion about the performance of the students and the interventions being put into place to address areas needing attention as well as celebrating some of the incredible growth students are showing.

Mrs. Arnette's report focused on the accomplishments of the fine arts department during the month of January. Our drama club did incredible with their production of "Murder at Crimson House" and two 6th graders were able to perform with the high school band at MMEA.

Mr. Dobson's report highlighted the juniors that took the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB). His report also celebrated the FHS Band performance at MMEA celebrated by a standing ovation from the audience.

Mr. Doolin's report highlighted a lot of the success at the middle school and gave credit to Mrs. Arnette for her leadership and expertise that she has brought to Fayette. He thanked the members of the Falcons for Facilities Improvement committee, Jenny Vroman, Brian Spielbauer, Cara Owings, Emily Bange, and Kyle Elliott. They are already doing great work to help promote the April Bond Issue.

The board revisited the adult lunch prices and approved the corrected prices from the January meeting. The food service review indicated that we had to raise adult prices to stay in compliance with the state. With the rising cost of produce and supplies student prices as well as adult prices could be adjusted again for the 23-24 school year.

The 23-24 School Calendar was discussed and passed by the board. Slight modifications were made from last year's calendar including adding 1 day to Christmas Break and changing the spring parent teacher conference day to Friday. The approved calendar is attached with this highlight.
